Division Rules

See Junior Division General Livestock Rules

All in-state junior livestock (cattle, sheep, goats and swine) showing at New Mexico Shows must have an NMLB APPROVED 840 tag and a Form 1 inspection issued by the NMLB before entering any county or state Fair. All out of state livestock must comply with New Mexico import requirements. The Form 1 inspection will be issued at the time the NMLB APPROVED tag is placed in the animal. The application of the tag will be done by the extension agent, FFA advisor or Fair personnel. The purpose of these requirements is to keep on file a record of animals that are commingled at Expos and shows.

Ownership:

Any animal shown in this department must continuously have been owned and personally cared for by the exhibitor since June 15 of the current year. Market Hogs must be tagged with an 840 ear tag. Any animal that has been sold through a non-premium sale in any state or county may not be exhibited at the SNMSFR.

YQCA Certification:

YQCA Certification Forms: All Exhibitors of Junior Market Animals are required to submit a YQCA Certificate number at entry. No Junior Market animal will be allowed to show without the number.

Entries:

The entry deadline is 10:59pm (mst) on the first Friday of September of the current year. Entries will only be accepted on-line through the Southern New Mexico State Fair website. The entry fee is \$15 per hog. The entry fee for the Showmanship Class is \$5. There is no limit on the number of hogs each exhibitor may enter. Late Entry Fee: Late Entries will be accepted until September 15 of the current year with a late fee of \$25 per animal. ALL ENTRIES WILL BE ENTERED & PAID ONLINE. Barrows & gilts may be shown in this division.

Arrival:

Jr. Market Hog entries must be on grounds by 12pm on Tuesday of Fair week.

Classification:

All swine will be classified during the online entry process. No official classification will happen during the weigh-in process Tuesday of fair week. However, classifications can be changed at weigh-in by the exhibitor. Once the Superintendent has submitted the check-in paperwork to the livestock office no further changes will

be allowed. DURING JUDGING OF THE SHOW, IF THE JUDGE FEELS THE ANIMAL DOES NOT MEET BREED CHARACTERISTICS, IT WILL BE PLACED ACCORDINGLY IN THE CLASS. ANIMALS WILL NOT BE MOVED TO A DIFFERENT CLASS.

Show Weight:

Minimum weight for Jr. Market Hogs is 200 lbs. with no maximum weight.

Fitting Regulations are as follows:

Absolutely NO dressing (such as oil, paint, dye, powder, etc.) other than water may be used on hogs. Any hog with dressing other than water will immediately be removed from the ring and will not be allowed to compete. Violators of this rule can be disqualified from the show by the judge and/or the superintendent.

Hogs will check in and show from the wash racks only. No showing from the pens.

Box Fans:

Will be allowed in the swine barns only with the approval of the superintendent. Fans will not be allowed in the aisles or attached to the fence. All electrical cords must be underwriters approved. Shavings will not be furnished by the SNMSFR.

Sale:

Junior Livestock Sale: A total of 34 Junior Market hogs will be eligible for the sale. These will be allocated in proportion to the number entered in each breed with the provision that a minimum of 2 per class will sell. Subject to change if number of entries require additional classes. The livestock committee will make determination.

****New for 2025** Exhibitors are allowed to sell 2 animals in the Livestock Sale, but they must be of different species.**

Releases:

Hogs will remain in place until the official check-out times (see schedule of events.) Release/destination sheets can be picked up in the livestock office at any time and are due back by 10:30 am Saturday of fair week.

A Showmanship contest will be held following the Grand Drive. The show is open to all entered exhibitors. Champion showmanship buckles will be presented in Novice, Junior and Senior age groups. A Showmanship class fee of \$5 must be paid at time of entry.

Classes

Breeds:

Duroc

- Must be red in color and possess Duroc breed character. (Ears must be down and medium size)
- Must NOT have any white hair located on the animal.
- Must NOT have any black hair.
- Must NOT have more than three black spots on the skin and none of these spots can be larger than two inches in diameter.
- Must NOT have any shading or indication of a belt.

Hampshire

- Must be black in color with a white belt starting on a front leg. The belt may partially or totally encircle the body.
- Must possess Hampshire Breed character. (Ears must be erect and not rounded)
- Must NOT have any white hair or indications of streaking on the forehead.
- Must NOT have any red hair.

Yorkshire

- Must be white in color and possess Yorkshire breed character. (Ears must be erect)
- Must NOT have any colored hair other than white.
- Must NOT have colored skin pigmentation larger than one U.S. minted silver dollar.
- Must not have masking above the eyes larger than a silver dollar.

Other Pure Breed

- Any other pure breed not listed.

Crossbred

- Hogs of any coloration pattern or pigmentation are eligible for entry in this breed.
