Division Rules

See Junior Division General Livestock Rules

All **in-state** junior livestock showing at New Mexico shows must have an NMLB approved 840 tag and a Form 1 inspection issued by the NMLB before entering any county or state Fair. All **out of state** livestock must comply with New Mexico import requirements. The Form 1 inspection will be issued at the time the NMLB approved tag is placed in the animal. The application of the tag will be done by the extension agent, FFA advisor or Fair personnel. The purpose of these requirements is to keep on file a record of animals that are commingled at Fairs and shows.

Ownership

Any animal shown in this department must continuously have been owned and personally cared for by the exhibitor for at least 90 consecutive days immediately prior to the opening of the fair. Any animal that has been sold through a non-premium sale in any state or county may not be exhibited at the SNMSFR.

YQCA Certification

All exhibitors of junior market animals are required to submit a YQCA Certificate number at entry. No junior market animal will be allowed to show without the number

Entries

Late Entry Fee: Late entries will be accepted until September 15, 2026, with a late fee of \$25 per animal.

Entries will only be accepted on-line through the Southern New Mexico State Fair website. The entry fee is \$15 per goat. The entry fee for Showmanship class is \$5. There is no limit on the number of wether dams each exhibitor may enter.

Entries in the Junior Wether Dam Show cannot be entered in the Junior Market Goat Show

Arrival

All junior wether dams are required to be on the grounds and checked in no later than 12:00 PM on Tuesday of show week.

Upon arrival on SNMSFR showgrounds NMLB form will be inspected by the NMLB. Animals will then proceed to the weigh station. Goats will be weighed and be presented for a health check. Blankets must be removed for health check. If any goats do not meet inspection requirements, they may not be allowed onto the showgrounds.

Once check-in has been closed at 12:00 PM, no further modifications or changes will be accepted

Once moved-in goats may not leave the grounds until released by the superintendents.

If you have any questions about check-in or inspection requirements, please reach out to the superintendents.

Show Weight

The minimum weight for Wether Dams is 40 pounds. There is no maximum weight.

Pens/Stalling

Depending on the number of entries goats will be placed 2 to 3 per pen.

Exhibitors are responsible for keeping pens clean and will provide their own bedding.

Pens must be cleaned of all bedding materials upon check-out.

Ethics

Exhibitors are expected to care and be present to groom their goats.

Fitting

• Allowed

- Light powder on body
- Conditioning spray on body
- Clear adhesive on legs only

• Not Allowed

- Oils
- Paints

The showgrounds electrical grid power is limited; generators are allowed. All generators must be placed in approved areas only and equipped with G.F.I.

It is up to the exhibitor as to whether dams are slick or coated, and may use collars or halters. They can be shown braced or natural while in the show ring.

Box Fans

Due to the heat, and the limited power grid of the showgrounds, box fans will be allowed with the following rules.

- Fans must be securely mounted within the exhibitor’s individual pen and may not be attached to any panel or side shared with another exhibitor.
- Fans must be equipped with a ground wire
- Attaching or extending an extension cord in an unsafe manner is prohibited
- Any cords may not obstruct alleyways, pens, or are in the way for animals to reach.
- Fans must be mounted in such a manner safe for the animal.
- No fans will be permitted in aisles and walkways.
- Fans may be inspected by any show staff. Any violations will be cause for removal of fan.

Release

Goats will remain in place until the official check-out times as provided in the schedule of events.

NOTE – if requesting early release for goats entered in other shows (county, national, or state shows) you must have proof of entry.

Classes

All junior wether dams will be divided by weight into classes at the discretion of the superintendents. Classes will be established after check-in and a list of classes will be posted.

Awards

- Classes
 - 1st place in class.....Wooden goat award, Ribbon
 - 2nd – 6th place in class.....Ribbons
- Grand Champion Drive
 - Grand Champion.....Buckle, Rosette, Metal award, Banner
 - Reserve Grand Champion.....Rosette, Metal award, Banner

Showmanship

Junior wether dam showmanship will be held in conjunction with the Market Goat Showmanship following the Junior Wether Dam Show. The class is open to all Junior Market Goat and Wether Dam exhibitors and must be entered at the time your online entries are made. The fee for the Showmanship class is \$5 and is paid with online entries.

The 1st place showman of each class will receive a buckle and classes will be the following.

Novice Showmanship

Junior Showmanship

Senior Showmanship

PeeWee Showmanship

A PeeWee Showmanship class will be held following Senior Showmanship. The class is open to all youth who are under the **MINIMUM** eligibility to show in the market goat show as of January 1 of the current year. 1st place PeeWee Showman will receive a buckle. PeeWee showmen may use either a market goat or wether dam, and all eligible are welcome to participate, no online entry required.
